Absences from School


If your son is going to be absent from school we require parents/carers to contact the school to explain their son's absence.



Year 11 GCSE Geographers took part in two days of fieldwork this term. They were investigating the impacts of redevelopment on Folkestone's environmental quality and of coastal management strategies on the characteristics of the beaches adjacent to the Lower Leas Coastal Park between Folkestone and Sandgate.



Boys collected a range of primary data from the field before returning to school to process, present and analyse their findings in order to test their hypotheses. These fieldwork and data handling experiences will be assessed in a new style skills-exam in the summer 2018 as part of the newly introduced linear GCSE course, awarded numerical 9-1 grades.

Both days provided an excellent opportunity for geographers to consider, from a fresh perspective, the physical and human characteristics of places they were already familiar with. To understand better the processes of change and its impact over time and space, linking the geographical theory learnt in class with real-world locations, was a positive outcome of the work undertaken.





The 'A' team have followed this up with good victories against Dover Grammar School and Buckswood in the National Cup. Elite Performance Squad

For it's third year, the Elite Performance Squad (EPS) has offered those high ability sportsman in selected sports, the opportunity to progress & develop their skills, knowledge & experiences within their favoured sports. High quality coaching sessions during their Games lessons as well as after school, helps them to not only progress as an individual, but also come together to put everything we work on in to a team & game environment.

Terms 1&2, as has been the case in the past couple of years, has focussed on football. Coming off of the most successful season in Harvey Grammar history in 2016/17 (where we won 2 county cups, made another final as well as 3 other semi finals), the enthusiasm from the boys towards football here at The Harvey is great. Add to that the very strong talent pool that we have across the board in all age groups, means that we are hopeful for another good year. For the first time this year, we have extended the EPS football system to Yr10, meaning that 120+ boys have access to high quality coaching for at least 2 hours a week. They work on phases of play, set pieces as well as develop their understanding of different systems within the game, in order to progress them as players & push them on further. Stretching even those that already represent the Kent Schools FA (KSFA) by getting the, to lead warm ups or aspects of a session.

As we go forward in to Term 2, we move from the Main Field to the 3G for lessons. After Christmas, we transition to the EPS Hockey system.

We were very fortunate to be awarded some funding to add an extension to our Sports Hall back in 2015. We have upgraded to 4 big changing rooms for the boys to use before & after activities.
