
Staff updates


Well done!

ENIBONMENTAL SCIENCE @ HGS



On Thursday 10th May, a group of **Year 10 Geographers** enjoyed an Environmental Science Day delivered by Hannah Battram, Education Services Manager and Karen Stanley, both from Affinity Water. Boys enjoyed informative and active workshops exploring three key issues regarding our management of such an important resource, both locally, nationally and globally:

Local and global water issues

The water supply stress test

A River catchment debate

The day culminated in boys representing six 'stakeholder' groups; developers, farmers, a conservation charity, The Environment Agency, a water company and sewage treatment works! Boys engaged in a lively debate as to how river catchments can be used and managed to meet conflicting demand for this valuable landscape.

'I enjoyed the experience; it was interesting, engaging and fun. It gave me an insight into things I take for granted or had never even thought of; latrine toilets and human fertilizer for example'!

'To illustrate what happens along the river Nile in Africa, we were given a bucket of



clean water to represent its source. As the Nile flows through different countries (from table to table in our activity), we took some out and put mud into it (symbolising countries taking it for farming and polluting it.) As to be expected, when the bucket got to the final table there was very little left; what remained was heavily polluted. This showed me personally how easily water



volume and quality can be lost through a river system and the impact that has on its communities'.

'The day taught me that water is a delicate resource. Although there is a lot of it, we still must manage it to ensure that one person's use of water does not affect another's'.

The day gave the boys an insight in to the challenge of managing such important resources in contested environments and was timely, given the Environment Agency's recent warning about the risk of water shortages facing England by 2050! A cohort now ready to help shape the way we use and



manage our valuable water resources in the future...


<u>GOLF</u> <u>Harvey Golf Championship 2018</u>


