Year 12 University of Cambridge Trip

On the 30th of October, Mrs Davis and Mr Goodfellow took a minibus of 15 Year 12 students on a day-trip to the University of Cambridge. The visit began with a talk from a representative of Queens' College who delivered a presentation created in correspondence with the University of Oxford which provided vital tips and advice on how to apply to Oxbridge from grade and subject requirements, personal statements, interviews and entrance exams as well as explaining the College system found at Oxford and Cambridge.



Following the talk, we met with two current Queens' College undergraduate students who took us on a tour of Queens' and did their best to answer our questions about the varied accommodation on site. Best described as a modern-day Hogwarts, the ornate and - in some places - bizarre site houses over 1,000 students, making it

the third largest College at Cambridge. Spiralling towers and stunningly ornate chapels aside, we crossed the Mathematical Bridge - designed to be quickly dismantled in conflict - and eventually reached a courtyard housing the College bar - with pints available for just £2.30 - and the canteen.

The end of our tour concluded the first half of our trip. We were then treated to an exquisite three course dinner at the canteen that far exceeded our expectations and was most welcome after a 2 1/2 hour minibus journey.





After lunch, we met with a Chemistry PhD student from France who used his current fascinating study of trapping liquids or gases - such as medicines - in solid particles in order to delay their release until specific conditions are met (such as temperature, the presence of a magnet or pH) as a vehicle to explain the process of entering academia through postgraduate study and assisting undergraduate students in their experiments.

After answering our questions about his work, we met with former Harvey student Jake Chapman who started his Engineering degree just a few weeks prior at St John's College with aspirations of specialising in Astrophysics. Jake took us on a short tour of the beautiful facilities of his College; St John's is Cambridge's second richest College (with assets exceeding £800m) and it really shows!

Finally, we were given the opportunity to explore the quaint cobbled streets of the city, the expansive shopping centres and the bustling, diverse marketplaces before hopping back on the minibus for the journey back to the Harvey.



All in all, it was an enjoyable and captivating trip that has inspired many of us to investigate the opportunities available to us after our A levels as well as encouraged a few to put in the extra effort that is required to study at one of the world's premier universities. We would all like to thank Mrs Davis for creating such a well organised and useful trip and Mr Goodfellow for taking the time to drive the minibus and accompany us throughout the day!


The Environment Council.

The group of instructors have been touring the country, sharing their knowledge and engaging pupils, making The Harvey exceptionally lucky to be involved in this process.

Over the course of the day, pupils explored various topics such as Hate Crime, Emotional Manipulation, Us vs Them as well as creating their own products and presentations to perform in front of the entire cohort.



We had the pleasure of hosting representatives of Google and ISD, both of whom are heavily involved in the workshop. They visited various classrooms, conversing with the students about how they are finding the experience and what they have learnt.

Local MP Damien Collins came to the school for the second time this academic year, engaging with pupils and involving himself in certain aspects of the day. He gave several speeches, outlining the importance of internet safety and online debates involving current affairs, to which the students responded positively.

Pupils were immersed in the world of competitive debate, challenging each other's views and opinions but conducting themselves in a non-intimidating approach. Dividing the classrooms into smaller groups, encouraging pupils to voice their own opinions which no doubt improved public speaking and confidence across the group.

Finally the boys created their own performances, whether it be a simple presentation, an audience interactive performance or in one case a rap!

It was exceptionally pleasing to see our students take to the experience, encouraging others and more importantly demonstrating how Harvey Students should conduct themselves.
















FOOTBALL


