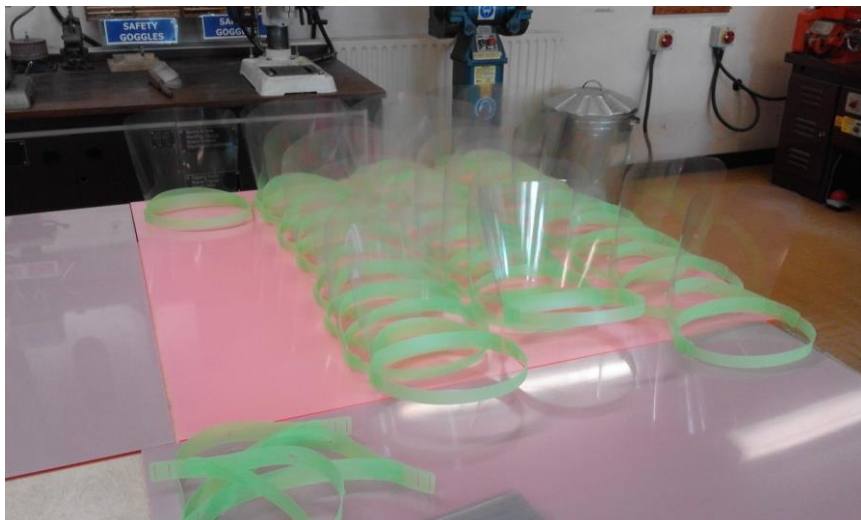
During lockdown...

He started out with donated materials from local businesses and from people on the *Next-Door Neighbour* website. As momentum increased, the School and the Rotary supported the purchase of material.

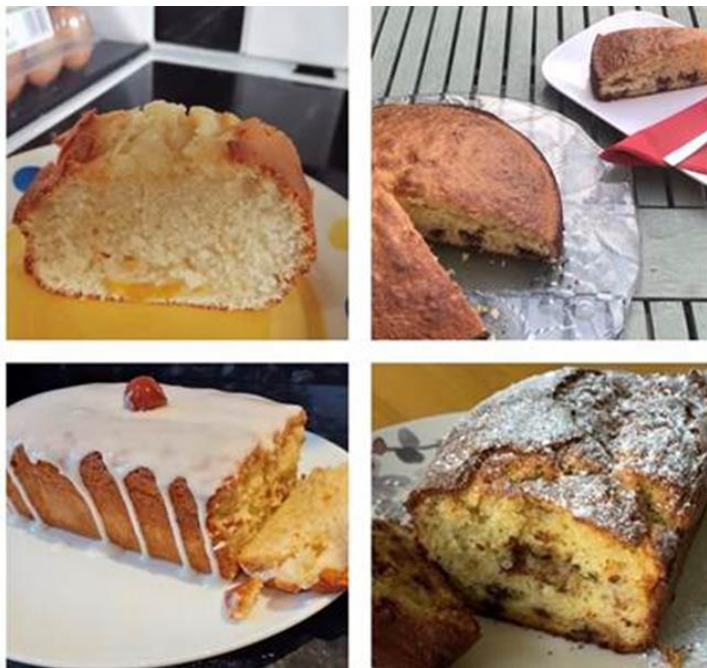

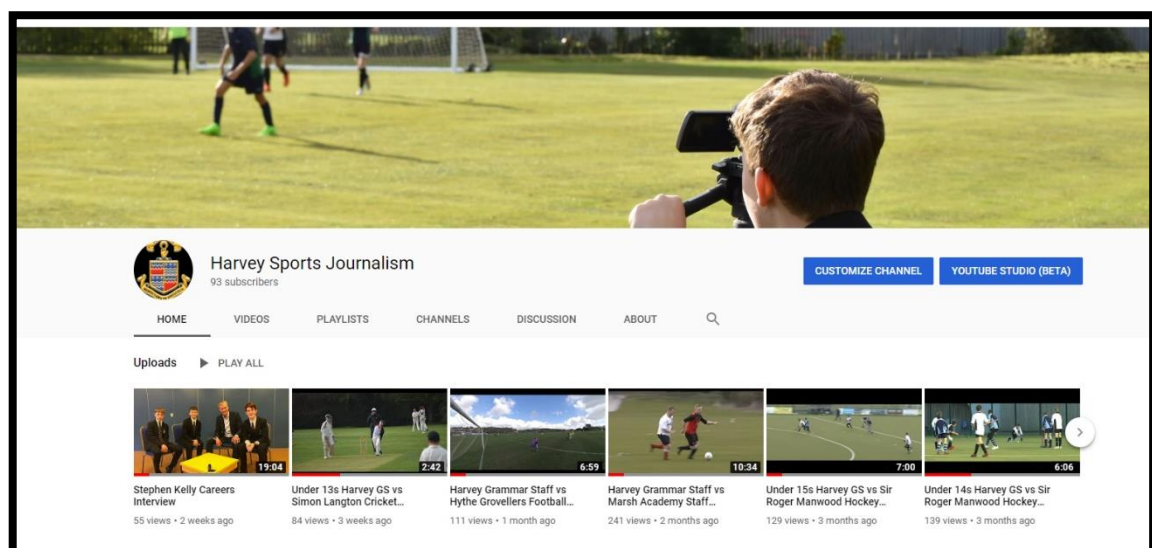
