

As has now become tradition, our year seven students made postcards of flags from around the world for staff to display in classroom and offices. Additionally, they researched facts about the country and discovered words from its language.



During lockdown, the school delivered PPE (including all googles, disposable aprons, and surgical gloves from the science department) to the William Harvey Hospital.






FOOTBALL




